CURRICULUM

The curriculum of Church & School of the Savior Pre-School reflects the need of the child for a variety of first-hand experiences to help them become aware of God's world and the world around them.

Through a discovery learning approach, each child has the opportunity to grow in many areas – language, math, art, science, music, social skills, and perceptual-motor development.

Our curriculum provides opportunities for both structured and self-directed learning. Our classrooms are designed with bright and colorful content aimed at teaching academics, values and spiritual lessons.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

An essential element of our curriculum is learning about God. They will also learn about loving God's creation which includes nature, animals and human beings.

SCHOOL STAFF

We offer an experienced staff who bring a variety of backgrounds to the educational experience. With knowledge of art, physical education, science, technology, music and special needs, our teachers share their experience and passion with the students. Our staff includes those certified in child development and elementary education.



CLASS OFFERINGS

Age 18 months to 2½

- **Happy Times** – an introduction to school, parent book club
- **All by Myself** - routines, parent separation

Age 3

- **Half, Extended & Full Day Programs** – colors and shapes, sharing and caring, taking turns, developing gross and fine motor skills, letter recognition

Age 4

- **Half, Extended & Full Day Programs** – kindergarten readiness, self-reliance, moral reasoning, number and name recognition, further development of motor skills
- **Enrichment Extended Day Program** – STEAM-based, hands-on learning, critical thinking
- **Study Buddies** – 1x/week, multi-sensory techniques to reinforce letter and number recognition

Age 5

- **Transitional Kindergarten** – program for children who don't meet the cut-off date to start kindergarten and give the gift the time to those students who are not academically, emotionally, or socially ready for kindergarten
- Curriculum includes handwriting, phonological awareness, basic math, fine motor skills
